

RONAN KEATING INTERVIEW WITH ASIALIFE

Just before his ground-breaking concert in Phnom Penh's Olympic Stadium, the Irish pop-star spoke with AsiaLIFE Phnom Penh's Deputy Editor, Liz Ledden about music, his family and Cambodia.

AsiaLIFE: Who are your main musical influences and favourite artists? **Ronan:** "I really like The Fray, Gavin DeGraw, bands like U2, Van Morrison, Bon Jovi, singer-songwriters like George Michael, and any new stuff, it always changes."

There's something about being in your own bed, we have a saying in Ireland that 'there's no fireplace like your own fireplace'. Although once I'm home for a while I look forward to travelling again, I really do love being on tour."
